

Camp@Home - Activities

This activity idea was originally part of a Durham Scouts Camp@Home event. It has been adapted for broader use as part of the Scouting from Home programme

Activities at home should always be risk assessed and supervised by parents/carers, taking note of the specific safety advice provided



Goat Climb

Please be sensible about this. Parents/carers should supervise this activity to ensure that young people climb within their abilities and at a level they are comfortable with.

Camp@Home3 – The Goat's Revenge was all about the goats (although we never did find out why the goat wanted revenge). Goats are well known for their ability to climb to unusual places – and hopefully get down again!

All you had to do (and this includes adults as well) is dress up as a goat and climb to an unusual or unexpected place. It doesn't have to be high – it just has to be unusual or unexpected.



Have you ever seen a goat on a washing machine, climbing frame, office chair, workbench or loft ladder? More confident goats can possibly be found on shed roofs, balanced on motorcycle seats or garden walls...

Take some time to prepare your goat costume – make a mask and some horns and wear your best woolly jumper and climb into an unusual or unexpected location.

During [Camp@Home3](#) we even saw the County Commissioner dressed as a goat on the roof of his shed...
